Upcoming dates to remember

Here are a few dates to keep in mind:

- March 17 – April 4 - Driver Education training for full-time Sask DLC students

- March 31 – Deadline to register for Power Engineering courses
- April 18 – Good Friday – Stat holiday

- April 30 – Deadline to enrol in Semester 2 Grade 10-12 Asynchronous courses
- May 1 – Registration for Summer School opens
- May 30 – Deadline for students to drop S2 and YL courses

All Students

1) Plans are underway to reach out to families currently enrolled full-time with us to confirm your enrolment plans for the 2025-26 school year. Be sure to watch for an email from us during the first week of April, which will include information on available learning options and a form to complete confirming your child's enrolment.

Grades 4-8

Students in grades 4-8 that are interested in competing in **Heritage Fairs Saskatchewan** can submit their virtual projects until April 24. Virtual projects are judged and have the chance of winning awards and/or attending provincials at the government house in Regina on June 14. To learn more visit [Saskatchewan Heritage Fairs](#).

Grades 10-12

1) Sask DLC is committed to recognizing and celebrating the accomplishments of our high school students. New this year, the following awards will be given to students with exemplary averages in their grade 10-12 courses.

- 75-79.9% - Merit Award
- 80-89.9% - Honours
- 90-94.9% - Honours with Distinction
- 95-100% - Honours with Great Distinction

These new awards are in addition to the Governor General's Academic Medal, awarded to the student with the highest average of all Grade 11 and Grade 12 classes on transcript.

Students must be full-time students with Sask DLC in grades 10-12 to qualify for the Honour Roll awards and must complete a minimum of six classes in the school year. If they take more than six classes, the highest six marks will be considered to get the average.

If you have any questions regarding these awards, please reach out to your campus principal.

2) 2025-26 High School course selection is open

If you are high school student attending a brick-and-mortar school and want to take a course not offered at your school for the 2025-26 school year, [please view our course catalogue](#) and talk to your Principal or Career Guidance counsellor to register.

Full-time Sask DLC students should speak with their Academic Advisor about courses that support their graduation plan. Contact information can be found by logging into DLCgo and clicking on "How to Contact Your DLC Academic Advisor" course.

We would appreciate if families were able to register by May 15 for us to begin preparations for the fall.

3) Driver Education for full-time Sask DLC students

The upcoming online Sask DLC Driver Education course for full-time Sask DLC students will run from March 17 to April 4. To participate, students must be at least 15 years old by March 17, 2025. Students aged 15–16.5 should have received an email by February 6 with more details. Students older than 16.5 as of March 17 can contact their Academic Advisor or email helpdesk@saskDLC.ca for information on how to enrol.
